PROJECT: Web-based full-service travel booking tool for high volume corporate travel agencies

Responsible for the user experience presentation layer of a web-based, corporate travel reservation application to be used primarily by travel agents who were accustomed to a command line interface. Worked closely with industry SMEs iterating and testing prototypes to design an application that took advantage of current technology, addressed the industry's needs and did not sacrifice usability.

- Created personas to identify primary users and introduce user centric design to development team
 - Diagrammed user activity and user workflow, including web service requests in later diagrams
 - Determined the site structure and navigational taxonomy for multiple user roles
 - Developed interactive prototypes for management demos
 - Adapted methodology and deliverables to fully integrate with development's Agile methodology

PROJECT: Client Console, Multi-Lingual Customer Support & Administrative Portal for new platform

Client console: An initiative to reduce internal costs led to development of a Client Remote Control Console. This web-based application allowed clients to directly setup and maintain their eCommerce catalogs, inventory control, and marketing campaigns. Internally, it eliminated the necessity of account managers dealing with day-to-day requests. Worked closely with Business and System Architect to design and develop a presentation layer that presented an efficient and intuitive user experience, met the business requirements and took advantage of the platform's capabilities while working within its limitations.

- Diagrammed User Task Flow
- Diagrammed Screen Flows and user interaction
- Wrote functional specifications for development
- Designed and developed visual interface

Customer Support: Digital River's on-site customer call center was using an older application originally intended for a previous platform. They needed one application to streamline the process and allow for greater efficiency. The project was such a success that Digital River decided to open access to their major customers so they could use the application in their call centers. This decision necessitated the localization of the UI into Chinese and Japanese and then various European languages.

- Onsite observation of user environment and methodology of call center operations
- Diagramed workflow to distinguish various alternative paths
- Employed rapid prototyping to quickly iterate design ideas incorporating user feedback
- Designed UI to accommodate internationalization (i18n) and localization (L10n)
- Wrote functional specifications

Administrative Portal: This internal application for account managers and support services was partially developed when Digital River acquired Orbit Commerce. However, development by multiple teams resulted in disparate interface standards between modules. In order to meet the release date, initially worked with Visual Design and Development teams to design, develop and deploy UI standards to create consistent user experience. Subsequent releases focused on streamlining and improving the user experience.

- Created standards & developer style guide for UI uniformity and consistency of user experience
- Identified page patterns and developed templates for same
- Created pattern library of UI widgets in order to maintain UI consistency
- Conducted user testing to determine weakness in workflow
